What Is Astrology?

The basic philosophy behind Astrology is the idea that we live in a holistic universe, that there is a deep interrelationship between the whole and its parts, and that anything, be it an event, a group, or an individual that is born at a particular point in time and space in a sense embodies the whole universe focused at that point.

Obviously it is impossible to determine the state of the whole universe from a particular point in time and space, so in Astrology we take the Solar system as the greater whole and regard the patterns formed by the Sun, Moon and planets as seen from a particular time and place on earth as a reflection of the forces acting at that time and place.

In natal astrology, astrology applied to individual human beings, the Sun, Moon and planets symbolise basic human needs, desires or urges which we all possess. It is the ever changing interrelationship between these basic functions or archetypes, and their relationship to the horizon at the time of birth, that are used to symbolise the personality structure of a human being.

Your Star Horoscope details the following:

Elements

Each of the twelve signs is assigned to one of the four Elements: Earth, Air, Fire and Water. Each planet together with the Ascendant and Midheaven according to it's sign therefore has an elemental quality.

Modality

Each of the twelve signs is assigned to one of three Modalities: Cardinal, Mutable and Fixed. Each planet together with the Ascendant and Midheaven according to it's sign therefore has a specific quality or mode of operation.

The Planets

The Sun, Moon and the planets: - Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune and Pluto, represent specific functions, drives, or urges within the total personality. Just as in the body the various organs; heart, kidneys, liver etc. perform their own specific functions yet operate as part of a total system; so the planets can be regarded as symbolising the 'organs' of your total personality.

The Outer Planets

The planets beyond Saturn: - Uranus, Neptune and Pluto, move through the signs so slowly that the sign positions of these planets refer more to the generation of which we are a part, rather than individual characteristics.

It is the house position that shows where we will meet with the principles expressed by these planets in our lives. The aspects of these planets to the personal planets show how we get on with the principles they represent.

These trans-Saturnian planets cannot be seen without the aid of a telescope. Therefore they represent powerful forces that are beyond conscious control. These planets connect us with forces and levels of reality beyond our experience as

individual human beings. They do this by breaking down the boundaries of the ego (symbolised by Saturn), to allow the inflow of higher ideals and goals into our ego-centred minds. This can often mean the total disruption or destruction of the outer and inner structures of our lives in order to make this possible.

Aspects

A conjunction is where two planets are at the same place, and their energies are merged together. Trines (when two planets are 120 degrees apart), and sextiles (60 degrees), between two planets indicate an easy flow of energy between the functions involved, they therefore show aspects of your personality that work harmoniously together indicating inherent abilities or talents.

Squares (when two planets are 90 degrees apart) and oppositions (when two planets are 180 degrees apart) show that there is some stress or tension between the two functions involved. Squares and oppositions between planets therefore indicate inner conflicts and tensions (conscious or unconscious) that throughout your life you will be forced to recognise and express in a positive way.

If you are not conscious of these inner conflicts, they will be confronted through seemingly 'fated' external events or in relationships with others, particularly when the planets involved are activated by transits (detailed in your forecast).

A tolerance or "orb" of about 8 degrees is allowed either side of the exact aspect, but the wider the orb, the weaker the influence. There are also two sets of minor aspects. They have a smaller orb of influence, and their effects are not always so noticeable.

These include the semi-sextiles (when two planets are 30 degrees apart) and the quinquinx (when they are 150 degrees apart). These minor aspects indicate energy patterns that are not well integrated into the individual's character. They exist, and of course, must be accommodated somehow.

The other series includes the semi-square (when two planets are 45 degrees apart) the sesquiquadrate (when two planets are 135 degrees apart). These minor aspects are quite similar to the square, only not quite as potent. They represent energy patterns that must be acted upon by the individual and, when properly used and understood, can bring about benefits in self-understanding.

This is not to say that trines and sextiles are "good" and squares and oppositions are "bad".

A chart dominated by flowing aspects may indicate someone for whom everything comes too easily, they will therefore lack any real motivation and may not achieve much during their life.

A chart with many stressful aspects, on the other hand, may indicate someone who driven by his or her own inner conflicts, can achieve something of real worth in their lives. The stressful aspects are just as necessary to us as the flowing aspects, and most of us are a fairly even balance of both.

The activity of each planet is further modified by the sign in which it is placed, the effects of these modifications in your particular case will be described in the chart analysis.

When astrologers cast horoscopes, it is important that the precise time of birth be used because it helps to determine the correct orientation of the houses of the chart. The position of the planets within the twelve houses, indicate which of these twelve areas of life concerns are most important for you.

Should a house have no planets, this does not mean that the affairs of the house are not important. It merely means that those affairs are probably well integrated and are not therefore major issues for you. But when a house has a planet or several planets, it indicates that the issues of the house are more significant.

The Signs

During the course of a year the Sun, as seen from the earth, appears to move in a circle against the background of the stars, this circle is known as the ecliptic. The axis of the earth's rotation is inclined at an angle to the plane of the ecliptic, so, if the earth's equator is imagined to be extended into space, it cuts the plane of the ecliptic at two points known as the equinoxes.

One of these points, the vernal or spring equinox, is taken to be the beginning of the circle and is known, both in Astronomy and Astrology, as the first point of Aries. Astrologers then divide the ecliptic into twelve sections of 30 degrees each thus generating the twelve signs. The autumn equinox is directly opposite the first point of Aries and is the beginning of the sign of Libra. When the Sun is at these points, days and nights are of equal length.

During the summer months the Sun appears to rise higher and higher in the sky, reaching its highest point at midsummer or the summer solstice, the beginning of the sign of Cancer. This is the time of the longest day and shortest night. Similarly, it reaches its lowest point in the sky in midwinter or the winter solstice, the beginning of the sign of Capricorn. This is the time of the shortest day and longest night.

The signs of zodiac therefore, has nothing to do with actual star constellations, but is based on the relationship between Sun and Earth.

The Houses

You will see that the chart is divided into twelve sections. These represent the division of the space surrounding you at birth. The sign on the first house "cusp" (the line that marks the beginning of the house) is the sign that was rising over the horizon at the time and place of your birth this is your rising sign, (or Ascendant). The sign on the seventh house cusp is the sign that was setting at the time of your birth, the line between the first and 7th house cusps therefore represents the horizon.

Planets in the upper hemisphere were therefore above the horizon at the time of birth, and planets in the lower hemisphere were below the horizon; planets in the left hemisphere (left of the line joining the 0th and 4th house cusps) were rising in the east and planets in the right hemisphere were setting in the west.

Each house represents a specific area of life experience. The positions of the planets in these houses therefore show in what areas of experience the effects of these planets will be most noticeable. The Ascendant is an important point and has its own particular meaning.

The Birth Chart

The birth chart is a symbolic map of the solar system as seen from the earth at the time and place of birth. The chart is comprised of three basic factors.

- (1) The aspects (angles) formed between the Sun, Moon and planets, as seen from the earth. These are indicated by the lines on a birth chart.
- (2) Each planet is located in a particular sign of the zodiac. The symbols for each sign are placed around the edge of the chart, Aries, Taurus, Gemini, Cancer, Leo, Virgo, Libra, Scorpio, Sagittarius, Capricorn, Aquarius, and Pisces.
- (3) Each planet is also located in a particular house in the chart. These are indicated by the twelve sections of a birth chart.

Your birth chart is therefore a unique blueprint of your personality, everyone is different. When you are born, the birth chart represents a set of potentials, it describes the "form" of your personality and the contents must be added through the experiences of life.

Star Horoscope Interpretation

Your birth chart shows the exact positions of the planets at your time of birth. It also tells you the sign of the Zodiac that was rising at your time of birth, known as your 'ascendant'. How the planetary positions of your birth chart relate to each other are interpreted on the following pages outlining your potential development. The interpretation begins with the Elements and Modalities of your horoscope.

Air Element highlighted - Jennifer's thoughtfulness

You have the capacity to stay completely detached and impartial, a fair judge of most situations. You are capable of understanding interrelationships when those more personally involved find it difficult to deal with. A sociable person but that does not mean that you necessarily get close to others, preferring to remain aloof. You love to live in the realm of your mind and are quite good at organisation and planning, and at developing new techniques. Be wary of being cold and emotionally unfeeling.

Earth Element under emphasized - Jennifer's dependability

You find it difficult to handle 'the matter-of-fact', daily detail of living. There is an inclination to be either confused most of the time or to be always making plans or schemes that you cannot complete. The dread of the responsibility of adulthood cause you to do things that others judge as juvenile or foolish. If you want to avoid that judgment, try to learn to establish a much stricter daily routine for yourself.

Mutable Quality under emphasized - Jennifer's adaptability

When you are faced by forces outside yourself that require you to change and adapt to new situations, you usually stubbornly resist. You change easily only if you are the one who starts the move. You have such an obstinate nature that it is very difficult for those with views opposing yours to get along with you and vice versa. Therefore, choose mates, business associates and friends from like-minded people if you want a stress free life.

The Ascendant

The Ascendant is the sign that was rising over the horizon at the time of birth. More than any other chart factor, the sign of the Ascendant to be accurate is dependant on both time (it changes by 15 degrees every hour) and place of birth (someone born at the same time on the opposite side of the world will have the opposite sign on the Ascendant or 'rising'). As such, it is the sign that brings us into physical incarnation, and the planet that rules that sign is said to be the ruler of the chart, or our planetary ruler for this lifetime. Hence the sign and house position of the Ascendant's ruler are of particular importance. The ascending sign shows the way in which we approach life and the world in general. It can be related to what some psychologists call the persona, the mask we place between our inner selves and the world. As such it shows the way in which, we are perceived by others, at least their first impressions of us. The Ascendant represents the manner in which we must express ourselves in order to feel secure, and also the filter through which we perceive life and its challenges. It is the cusp of the first house, the house associated with our personal identity and self expression and represents the kind of energy and types of activities that we need to enliven us physically.

AS **Libra Ascendant**

Libra is a Cardinal Air sign. With Libra rising at the time of your birth, you express Libran characteristics in your approach to life. There is a need to base action on an objective and fair assessment of any situation. The keynote of Libra is balance. Libra on the ascendant gives you the ability to see the various alternatives in any situation, and to see the other persons point of view. However, if overdone this can lead to indecisiveness that can be crippling to action, and a sitting on the fence type of behaviour. You try to base your actions on what is true and just, but must learn to make decisions and accept responsibility for the consequences. The first impression others have of you is of a friendly, fair and just person, or as somewhat superficial and indecisive in your behaviour.

Libra is ruled by Venus, the position of this planet will be of particular importance in your chart.

AS   ★★☆☆☆**Ascendant Trine Sun**

With your Sun and Ascendant in a Trine aspect you will be aware of your creative talents, and you feel that you could succeed in almost anything you try to do. While this is probably true with this aspect, the Trine, of itself, does not provide sufficient drive and motivation, that must come from other areas of the chart, so you may neglect or waste your natural talents through laziness or the tendency to keep putting things off until tomorrow.

You would prefer a career that will allow you to express your creativity and make demands on your natural talents, and you will probably become a professional in whatever career you choose. The pressure of competition and the demands of proving your worth in your chosen field will provide the drive to realise your full potential.

AS   ★★☆☆☆**Ascendant Sextile Moon**

The Ascendant Sextile the Moon indicates that you are sensitive to what others say to you or about you. This was particularly true when you were younger, but as you grow older this sensitivity will turn into a deeper understanding of yourself and others, although at times you will still have difficulty in separating fact from fiction, or tend to believe only what makes you feel comfortable with yourself. You pick up easily on the moods and emotional states of others, and may find it difficult to disguise your own moods.

AS   ★★☆☆☆**Ascendant Square Mercury**

The Square between Mercury and your Ascendant indicates some difficulty in communicating with others. In your eagerness to impress, or to cover your basic insecurity, you tend to talk excessively, taking over conversations and expressing your own opinions too quickly or forcibly. Other people may feel that they are being talked at, rather than talked to, and find it difficult to follow, or even to believe, what you are saying. You may often find that you have been misunderstood or misrepresented when you believe that you have expressed yourself clearly. You need to learn the art of listening as well as speaking, and slow down the pace of your conversation so that others can get a word in.

Ascendant Semisextile Mars

The Semisextile between your Ascendant and Mars indicates that you have a lot of nervous energy, which needs to be channelled into positive directions. You find it difficult to relax and be still, always needing to be on the go or doing something, but often not quite sure what. As a result, you can waste a lot of time and useful energy just fiddling around and getting nowhere.

You are not afraid to speak your own mind. While this can at times be a positive quality, you tend to speak without giving thought to the effects of your words on other people, you can say hurtful or annoying things without even realising it.

Ascendant Opposition Saturn

The Opposition between your Ascendant and Saturn inhibits the way you approach relationships and other people in general. There may be a deep sense of insecurity about the way other people perceive you, so you prefer to let other people come to you rather than going to them, thus avoiding the possibility of rejection or being given the cold shoulder. As a result, many people who would like to know you better may be put off by your apparent air of indifference. While you are inwardly unsure of your ability to handle responsibility, when the chips are down, you are better able to do so than most people, you just need to learn this through your own experience.

Ascendant Semisextile Pluto

The Semisextile aspect between Pluto and your Ascendant indicates that you have an intensity and power that enables you to persuade others to do your bidding. You do not take challenges to your ideas or desires lightly, and will tend to express your point of view strongly even if, deep inside, you know that you are wrong. You are aware of many of the problems that afflict our society, and have little time or sympathy for those you feel are responsible, or for their supporters. You will feel the need to be some kind of agent for social reform, but whether this need stays in the realm of an idea or desire, or whether you put it into practice in some way will depend on aspects in the rest of the chart.

**The Sun**

In the solar system the Sun is the centre around which all the other planets revolve, bound by its gravitational force. Similarly, in the birth chart the Sun represents the "centre" of our personality, or the core of our being, around which all the other psychological drives and needs, symbolised by the planets, revolve.

Just as, in the solar system, the Sun is the source of light and life generating energy, so the Sun represents the source of consciousness and life within us all. It is our will to be and our sense of individuality. The birth chart, however, represents the solar system as seen from the earth, not the Sun. Most of us are not centred in our Sun, but in our earthbound, or sense-bound ego. For most of us then, the Sun represents our "Higher Self" or Spirit. It is the immortal spark of the universal spirit which is uniquely ourselves, as opposed to our transient and mortal ego centred personality. The Sun is therefore what we are striving to become.

The sign position of and aspects to the Sun, as seen from the earth, show how this radiant inner self works through the medium of our ego centred personality. It is the fundamental tone of our being, and as such is the most important placement in the chart.



Sun in Aquarius

Aquarius is a fixed air sign. In astrology, air represents the activity of the mind, the realm of ideas and social interaction. The fixed nature of this sign lends these thoughts and ideas the power to form the basis of groups united through shared ideals and goals. Aquarius is the time of year before the spring, before the seed has begun to swell in the earth. At this time the whole of nature is oriented toward the future growth. The ideals of Aquarius are forward looking and revolutionary.

With the sun in Aquarius your basic tone is idealistic, forward looking and unconventional, but probably rather detached and impersonal. You are by nature either a rebel, or a humanitarian and a true reformer. You need to insure that your rebellious nature and insistence on holding unconventional views does not become fanaticism and a refusal to change your opinions. You can be either original or eccentric, probably a mixture of both.

4th House

The 4th House is naturally associated with the sign of Cancer and its ruling planet, the Moon.

In the 3rd House we are concerned with communicating with our immediate environment, this leads, in the 4th, to the need to establish a private domain to which we can retreat from the world.

The 4th House represents our roots, both psychological and material. In the psychological sense it is our early family and cultural conditioning, which gives us a sense of belonging, and produces deep inner feelings and habit patterns. The 4th House together with the opposite House, the 10th, is connected with our experience of our parents. In the material sense it is our own home, from which we go out to meet the world and to which we can retreat to rest and recuperate. As well as representing our early home environment, this House is also connected with the conditions surrounding us during the second half of life.



Sun in 4th House

With the Sun in the 4th house of your chart, there is a great need to delve deep within to find yourself. There may be a struggle to define your individuality on the home and family front. You need to distinguish your own individual identity and avoid the danger of deriving too much of your identity from your family background or heredity. On the other hand, there is a danger of rejecting your family background completely in order to free yourself from its influence.

Neither your own individuality nor your family background should be rejected. The task is to balance the two, acknowledging your heredity and developing your own uniqueness.



Sun Sextile Moon

With the Sun and the Moon in a Sextile aspect, you have learned from the experiences of your past, and these experiences serve as a valuable foundation for the present and future. You have the inner confidence and courage to face life's challenges.

Your relationship with your parents as a child would have probably been with major conflicts, and this has carried into adulthood as you generally get on with your parents, and they are always there to lend a helping hand when you need it. Even if their own relationship had problems, this probably would not have had any long term effects on your own relationship with either of them.



Sun Square Mars

With the Sun in a Square aspect to Mars in your chart, this indicates that you have a great deal of energy and drive and can work hard for long periods. However, when things do not happen to go your way, you can over-react and occasionally take your frustration out on friends, family and colleagues.

You are also impatient with any kind of restriction on your freedom, liking to do what you want when you want. But without the occasional compromise, this could inevitably cause conflicts.

Having said all this, this aspect also gives a tremendous drive to succeed in whatever it is you have set your heart on, and a tireless energy that will eventually get you to your goal.



Sun Sextile Saturn

The Sextile aspect from the Sun to Saturn indicates that you are generally able to pursue your goals and ambitions with patience, determination and self-discipline. You are aware of your limitations as well as your talents, and you are able to learn from your experiences. You have a burning ambition to succeed in some area, but you realise that success has to be earned if it is to be worthwhile.

Your relationships with colleagues and bosses are generally good. As a result you will eventually achieve a position of prominence and authority in your chosen career, brought about by competence, efficiency and integrity.



Sun Square Neptune

With the Square between the Sun and Neptune you may occasionally experience some confusion concerning your sense of who you are, and where you are going in life. Past experiences and events may occasionally raise issues that force you to examine yourself honestly and understand how you drew these experiences to you, and what you must learn from them. However, at times, you will often evade reality by escaping into a world of dreams and fantasy.

There will also be times when you tend to underestimate your abilities, with the fear of failure preventing you from doing things that you would be fully capable of. In time, and probably after a great deal of self analysis, you will become more confident about your own creative potential and set higher goals for yourself.



Sun Quinquinx Pluto

The Quinquinx between the Sun and Pluto suggests a powerful need to be in control. You feel, perhaps as a result of childhood experiences with your parents or some other authority figure, that life is a constant battle to dominate or be dominated. Because of the nature of Pluto you may not even be fully conscious of this tendency, therefore at times you can alienate others without your being aware of the reasons.

Build up of inner turmoil or tension will eventually be released, often explosively; hence you can exhibit perfect self-control in the most difficult circumstances, but hit the roof over something trifling and unimportant.

If you can use the power of this aspect constructively rather than destructively, you will find that you have tremendous reserves of energy and will-power that will enable you to achieve whatever you desire. You just need to make sure that what you want can be achieved without causing conflict with others and learn to compromise and meet opposition half way.

**Moon**

In the birth chart, the Moon is second in importance only to the Sun. Unlike the other planets the Moon orbits the earth, and seen from the earth is the same size as the Sun (hence the possibility of total eclipses). The Moon gives off no light of its own, however, but reflects and polarises the light of the Sun.

The Moon represents memories, feelings and instinctive responses that lie just below the level of consciousness. As the Moon orbits the earth, it generates the movements of the tides and governs other natural cycles, such as the menstrual cycle in women. The Moon therefore symbolises the ebb and flow of feeling and emotion (symbolised by water in Astrology), and the feminine principle in nature and in the individual.

The sign position of and aspects to the Moon show how we react instinctively, and what we need to feel comfortable and secure. As children the Moon is the Mother, or at least how we experienced our mother. As we grow older this extends to our relationships with women in general (particularly for men), and our instinctive or conditioned responses to the world in general; based on the often unconscious memories of this early nurturing experience (or lack of it).

When the time of birth is not known the exact position of the Moon may be different to that shown in your Midday birth chart. You can experiment with alternative birth times to see if the Moon's sign changes on the day you were born and read the different interpretations for each Moon sign.

**Moon in Sagittarius**

The sign position of the Moon shows how we react instinctively, based on past experience and habit patterns. With the Moon in the mutable fire sign of Sagittarius, you are instinctively restless, with difficulty in settling down and staying in one place for too long. You feel happy with yourself if you can be exploring new horizons, or are on the move, even if it is only from one home to another. Your emotions can be fiery and you will defend yourself instinctively by reacting with anger. If your sense of security is threatened or your self image challenged you may respond with exaggeration and can be careless and tactless. You will have a high degree of independence and love of freedom, but will need to control a tendency to be off-hand.

2nd House

The 2nd House is naturally associated with the sign of Taurus and its ruling planet Venus.

After establishing our self-identity in the 1st House, we turn, in the 2nd, to our possessions and what we own. This House represents the area of life concerned with the accumulation of wealth and resources as a secure basis from which to act in the world. This can mean the accumulation of money and material possessions, but on a higher level, it represents innate or acquired skills and gifts which give us a sense of value, worth and personal security. The 2nd House stabilises the self-identity acquired in the 1st.

**Moon in 2nd House**

The Moon is in the 2nd House of your chart, the area which rules possessions and money. The Moon in this House indicates that past experiences will have resulted in a need for possessions and material wealth in order to feel comfortable and at ease with yourself. The fluctuating nature of the Moon, however, means that your finances may be subject to changes and instability.

You may also have an emotional attachment to the things you own, particularly things that are in some way related to your past or your family. You have probably inherited your sense of values from your family background, particularly from your mother.

**Moon Semisextile Mars**

The Semisextile between the Moon and Mars shows that, when necessary, you can be fearless and direct in expressing your emotional needs, perhaps too forceful at times. In your childhood, you learned to be open about your needs, to say what you want and to know how to go about getting it. Fear of rejection doesn't really bother you, as you have an emotional strength that is able to cope with all the knocks that come your way.

You rely strongly on your intuition in an argument. You know your own feelings and are able to express them with a forcefulness that is difficult to oppose. You also instinctively know your opponents' weak points, and are able to hit them where it hurts most when you feel it necessary.

**Moon Trine Saturn**

The Moon in a positive Trine aspect to Saturn will provide a stabilising influence to other more stressful aspects of your personality. Your early home life and conditioning will probably have given you a deep sense of responsibility and the need for self-discipline which will always be there. Even if you rebel against it at times, you still take your responsibilities seriously.

Emotionally you may be rather reserved, perhaps even inhibited in some ways, and you will need to feel completely secure before you reveal your deepest feelings to anyone. Nevertheless, you always have a ready shoulder for others to cry on.

You have excellent organisational abilities and can put a lot of creative effort into your home and professional life. You do not ask for more than you give out, and feel that you have to earn whatever you get, an end to which you can work with discipline and patience.



Moon Square Pluto

The Square between your Moon and the powerful planet Pluto will give you a rather intense and demanding emotional nature. You will occasionally tend to demand a great deal from those to whom you are emotionally attached, but may be reluctant to give much or accept too much responsibility in return.

As a result, your emotional life may be the source of conflicts and power struggles. There may be times when you may try to manipulate another through feelings of guilt, possessiveness and jealousy, or you may be the victim of such attempts at manipulation. Past emotional difficulties may have left deep-seated scars that have not completely healed, and which come to the surface from time to time.

At times you may be forced to let go of past emotional attachments, memories, or ways of being. Painful though these experiences may be, this aspect indicates that they are necessary for your personal growth.



Mercury

Mercury is the closest planet to the Sun. Along with Venus it is one of the inferior planets, that is, its orbit lies within the earth's orbit.

In mythology, Mercury is the messenger of the gods. In the birth chart, Mercury represents the urge to communicate with and exchange information with others. In the mind, it represents our rational thought processes, or the ability to analyse and reach logical conclusions. In the body, it is the nervous system, which co-ordinates and unifies all the different bodily functions into an organised whole. Mercury can be said to represent electricity in the form of information. Mercury therefore rules all forms of communication and exchange of information, and the ability to organise facts into a consistent view of the world.

The sign position of and aspects to Mercury in the chart show how one thinks and communicates, that is, the way in which our thoughts are expressed, and the way in which we receive such information from the world around us.



Mercury in Aquarius

Mercury in the fixed air sign of Aquarius indicates that your mind is open to forward looking and revolutionary ideas. You have good judgement and objectivity in your thinking, but once you have formed your opinions it may be difficult for you to change them. You have an attraction to and talent for the sciences, and for subjects that many consider to be beyond science, such as metaphysics or astrology. You have the true Aquarian mind and are attracted to groups that express new age ideals. But, you have to check the tendency toward eccentric and opinionated thinking, and you tend to be rather detached and impersonal in your communications with others.



Mercury in 4th House

Mercury in the 4th House sometimes indicates an intellectual or academic home background in childhood. The emphasis may have been put on being rational and sensible, perhaps at the expense of deeper feelings and closeness.

Throughout your life, there is the possibility of educational activities being carried out in your home, and you would benefit from some kind of study even into the second half of life.



Mercury Trine Jupiter

The Trine between Mercury and Jupiter indicates a well-developed and open mind. You absorb knowledge quickly, and are always eager to learn as much as you can. You are able to communicate well, but at times may be over enthusiastic when expressing your own point of view. Nevertheless, because of your ease at communication, you will generally fit in well at all levels of society, and your openness and honesty will give others the confidence to entrust you with positions of responsibility.

Your broad philosophical outlook and understanding of other people will be an asset in any career occupation that involves teaching or helping people, since you will be concerned with helping them to develop what is best in themselves, rather than indoctrinating them with a particular point of view



Mercury Trine Uranus

The effect of the planet Uranus is often likened to electrical energy with the Trine aspect to Mercury your nervous system and intellect is stimulated and electrified, but in a way that is creative rather than difficult. Your mind works so fast that you may consider other peoples thinking slow by comparison, you can analyse a problem and see instantly connections and possibilities, and make logical leaps, hat others may labour over for a long time. When you reach a conclusion it seems as if the answer just came intuitively, when in fact it was the result of extremely fast analysis.

You have an original and inventive mind open to new ideas and new ways of thinking, you seek knowledge avidly for the freedom and understanding you gain from it, rather than for any qualifications you may gain. Forward looking and revolutionary you have creative solutions to many of the world's problems, and have little patience for traditional and conventional solutions or ways of thinking, you would certainly not regard 'Victorian values' as a solution to present day problems



Mercury Sextile Neptune

The Sextile between Mercury and Neptune indicates that you have a sensitive and intuitive mind, often sensing and seeing things that others may miss. You have a strong imagination, with thoughts that can be inspired, but you do not generally waste time in daydreaming, as the ideas that come to you have to stand the test of reason. You are idealistic, but not unrealistic.

You need to plan some kind of goal to follow, and possibly get into higher education, in order to make the most of your imagination and understanding, for whilst aspects between Mercury and Neptune opens the mind to limitless possibilities, some formal training or discipline is needed to make the most of their beneficial influence



Mercury Trine Pluto

With the positive Trine aspect between Mercury and Pluto you have an analytical mind that is able to penetrate beyond surface appearances. You are therefore suited to any form of research or investigation since you are always wanting to get to the truth of any matter.

You need to find some kind of meaning to life and your experiences and then to communicate the understanding and knowledge gained from your experiences to others. But do beware being too opinionated as at times you will identify too strongly with what you believe in, and will defend your viewpoint without compromise

**Venus**

Venus, like Mercury, lies within the orbit of the earth. If Mercury can be likened to electricity in the form of information, then Venus can be likened to the magnetic field generated by the electric current. One of the meanings of Venus is therefore "personal magnetism".

In mythology Venus is the goddess of love. In the birth chart, Venus represents the social and love urge, and the need for harmony and exchange of feelings and affection with others. Venus is our need to form relationships and our power to attract such relationships. It is also our sense of values, based on what attracts or repels us.

The sign position of any aspect to Venus shows how we express these needs to others and the kind of response we need in order to feel in harmony. If Venus is adversely aspected these responses may not always be what we consciously desire but are often necessary in order to force us to recognise some unexpressed part of ourselves.

**Venus in Aries**

Venus was in the sign of Aries at the time of your birth. Aries, a cardinal fire sign can be bold and adventurous, or headstrong and impulsive. With Venus in this sign, you will tend to be passionate and impulsive in your reactions to matters concerning love and affection, with a tendency to jump into things pretty quickly. You will be persuasive and demonstrative in your relationships, and not given to putting restraints on your affections. You will need to control a self seeking urge in your relationships and may tend to be rather inconsiderate to those loved, probably without realising it, due to an insistence on doing your own thing, and lack of consideration for the other persons feelings.

6th House

The 6th House is naturally associated with the sign of Virgo and its ruler Mercury.

Having expressed our creativity in the 5th, the 6th House is where we are confronted with the need to adjust to, and learn from, the demands of the material world. This is the House associated with work and service. The 6th House indicates the nature of, and our attitude toward, our working environment and our relations with co-workers, employees or bosses. It is also connected with health and the interaction of mind and body to maintain the efficient (or inefficient) working of our physical bodies.

**Venus in 6th House**

With Venus in the 6th House of your chart, you will feel that if a job is worth doing, it is worth doing well, but you may occasionally find that whilst you are striving for perfection in what you do, you are overtaken by competitors who are prepared to accept less than the best.

Physical health is important to you but you may also find that many illnesses or health problems are as a result of over-indulgence or lack of self-discipline in some area of your life.

**Venus Opposition Jupiter**

The Opposition between Venus and Jupiter indicates that at times you can be extravagant and self-indulgent, but you are also generous and affectionate. However, always seeking new horizons, you will also need a great deal of space for yourself in relationships. Your relationships need to be a constant source of new experiences and excitement, otherwise boredom will quickly set in and you may try to find what you feel you are missing somewhere else.



Venus Opposition Uranus

Venus and Uranus in Opposition is a rebellious combination. This indicates that you have a need to be close to someone, but at the same time you may stubbornly resist any restrictions being placed on your own personal freedom. As a result, others may occasionally find you difficult to get close to on an emotional level.



Mars

Mars is the first planet in the series out from the Sun that is outside the orbit of the earth. As the first superior planet, Mars represents energy directed outward from the self into the world. It is the energy to initiate action and the ability to meet challenges and overcome obstacles. In mythology, Mars is the god of war. In the birth chart, Mars is the self assertive and aggressive urge, the sex drive and the need to achieve our desires. Positively, Mars is expressed as courage, initiative, and the will-power to pursue our goals. Negatively expressed, Mars is impatience, violence and the use of force or threats.

The sign position of and aspects to Mars in the chart show how we assert ourselves and express our desires. Mars is traditionally a masculine planet, and therefore represents the expression of the male ego. In a women's chart, the energy of Mars is often repressed by social and family conditioning, and indicates how she will experience the male ego through the men around her, whether positively or negatively expressed. It is, however, becoming increasingly possible for women to break away from traditional passive roles, and express their own Martian drives, but this is often not completely successful until after the age of about 30.



Mars in Scorpio

With Mars in the fixed water sign of Scorpio, your self assertive and aggressive drives are coloured by powerful and often unconscious feelings. Your sense of self-preservation is strong and you may get what you want from others through the subtle manipulation of feelings of jealousy and possessiveness. When you have these feelings yourself, which you very often will, they will not be overtly displayed, but will be kept below the surface and expressed in a subtle and manipulative way. You have an unshakeable emotional strength, and an instinctive understanding of "human nature" and what motivates people, although you may have a tendency to dwell too heavily on the negative manifestations.



Mars in 2nd House

The planet Mars in the 2nd House of your chart shows that you are prepared to work hard to surround yourself with the luxuries of life. You know what you want, and like to do things your own way. What is more, this stubborn insistence usually means that opposition to your way of doing things ends up getting pushed aside, you generally win.

In fact, you will generally fight for the things that you value with a persistence and determination that is second to none, but at times you will also need to stand aside from the fight, just to properly review the situation, otherwise you may find yourself expending a great deal of energy struggling for something that is no longer appropriate or necessary for you.



Mars Conjunct Neptune

The Conjunction between Mars and Neptune indicates that occasionally you may have difficulty in asserting yourself, or getting your message across. At times you will be confused and uncertain about what you really want, and your direction in life, with this same self-doubt stopping you from taking effective action.

Occasionally you may leave yourself open to deception from others. In romance particularly, you need to exercise discrimination and judgement. Remember the higher the pedestal you place your lover on, the greater the distance to fall.



Mars Sextile Pluto

The Sextile between Mars and Pluto indicates that your willpower is strong, and generally well directed and purposeful, but you also have a deep need to seek for the truth.

You express your thoughts forcefully, and you have the ability to present your case to others with power and conviction, and even win support for what others may regard as a hopeless case.

However, you must remember that although you may generally feel strong and confident in your own opinions and ideas, no-one is always right. You will therefore need to consciously develop a respect for other people's opinions, and to accept that their opposition to you is not meant personally. They may very well have a valid case if you would only stop to listen.



Jupiter

The planets up to and including Mars have been concerned with the establishment of ourselves as individuals, and with the satisfaction of our own needs and desires. The planets beyond Mars connect us with a larger order.

As the largest planet in the solar system, Jupiter represents expansion and growth. It is the urge to grow beyond our individual limitations and the need to feel part of a larger order, whether this be a particular religion, philosophy or social system. Jupiter, the king of the gods, is traditionally the bestower of faith, optimism and the ability to expand and prosper. It is the planet that promotes personal growth, gives us confidence in ourselves and trust in a higher power or greater plan. Negatively, Jupiter can manifest as overconfidence, irresponsibility and the tendency to over-extend ourselves or promise too much.

The sign position of and aspects to Jupiter in the chart show what kinds of experiences and types of activity create an inner faith and optimism, and the sense of being connected to the larger scheme of things.



Jupiter in Libra

With Jupiter in the cardinal air sign of Libra, opportunities will come to you as a result of your need for a wide variety of social contacts and acquaintances. Your judgement is fair and impartial, you are aware of the injustices and prejudices of society and have a strong desire to help those who are oppressed or unfairly treated, or to do something to help make the world a better place. This desire may remain just that, however, since your diplomatic nature and your natural ability to see all sides of any issue may paralyse the urge to action. The same qualities, if you can overcome your indecisiveness, can bring you great success in any field that involves working with or negotiating on behalf of the general public. In relationships, you will seek those that in some way broaden your perspective and experience.

12th House

The 12th House is naturally associated with the sign of Pisces and its ruler Neptune.

After becoming part of a larger group structure in the 11th, in the 12th House we experience the dissolution of our separate individual ego. This House represents the area of experience where we feel that we are influenced by forces and powers that are beyond our control. In this House we surrender our individual wills to the service of a higher power or ideal, or direct our energies toward greater self realisation and spiritual goals.

On a more mundane level, this House is associated with large institutions such as hospitals and prisons, where many people end up if the self-surrender described above is overdone, or made to the wrong ideals. Hence this House is also known as the House of self-undoing.

**Jupiter in 12th House**

With Jupiter in the 12th House, no matter how dire your circumstances may become, you have a deep-seated faith that life itself will provide for your needs, and indeed you will more than often be saved in the nick of time from impossibly difficult circumstances by what appears to others to be good luck, but in fact it is luck which you have created from your own thoughts and actions.

**Jupiter Conjunct Uranus**

The Conjunction between Jupiter and Uranus shows that you look to the future with high expectations. You have an insatiable need to absorb more knowledge. You are also generally able to express the knowledge that you have gained in such a way that you can open up the minds of others to higher goals and ideals.

**Saturn**

Saturn is the last planet in the solar system that can be seen with the naked eye from the earth. As such, together with the fact that it is bounded by a series of rings, Saturn represents the boundaries of the individual.

After the limitless expansion of Jupiter, Saturn in the birth chart represents boundaries and limitations. It is the principle of structure and form. In the body, it is the skeleton, which gives the body its structure, and the skin, which is the boundary to the outside world. In the mind, it is the structure of our ego and our sense of self which we seek to preserve from the impact of changes from within and from the outside world. Saturn gives us the ability to endure setbacks and work with discipline and patience toward well defined aims. It is the need for social approval through some kind of tangible achievement. Whereas Jupiter brings rewards and opportunities through what we might call good luck, Saturn brings rewards and opportunities through hard work, limitation and self discipline.

The sign position of and aspects to Saturn show how we seek to establish ourselves as individuals and find our place in the social system of which we are a part. Any form or structure, however, when placed in the light of the Sun tends to cast a shadow. The position of Saturn in the chart therefore, shows where we find our "shadow". It is here that we meet with our greatest sense of inadequacy, lack of faith and inhibitions. Saturn shows where we are most fearful, and hence most rigid; but if these fears can be met and overcome it is the source of our greatest strength and a solid foundation from which to meet the world.



Saturn in Aries

With Saturn in the cardinal fire sign of Aries, you will need to work hard at developing the qualities of spontaneity and courageous action. You will have a deep insecurity about leading or taking control, but this is precisely what you need to do in order to make use of the controlled energy of this placing. You do not like to be given orders, or told what to do, you prefer to do things your way, and get others to do them your way too. You have great organisational skills, a born director, you need to find some outlet for these abilities if you are not to feel restricted and frustration. If you do not develop this energy in the wider world, you could become demanding and dictatorial at home. You need to develop respect for other people's ambitions and goals, you tend to regard your own as more 'important' or immediately urgent, but continued co-operation from others requires that you support them also.



Saturn in 6th House

Saturn in the 6th House of your chart indicates that whilst you probably have good managerial and organisational skills, you may find dealing with the day to day running of your life burdensome. Duties such as cleaning the House and taking care of your finances are seen as a restriction on your freedom that you would rather do without.

The 6th House also refers to the general physical health, whilst Saturn refers to our fears and inhibitions. Therefore, with this combination, some of your illnesses could be the result of repressed emotions that really need to be brought out into the open and dealt with. They're like messages from your body that all is not well at deeper levels of your psyche.

This also applies to your work situation. When there are difficulties with bosses or colleagues, or you will stuck in a job you do not like, then work may be avoided by falling ill. If this is the case, then change your job.



Uranus

Uranus is the first of the trans-Saturnian planets. It cannot be seen with the naked eye and was discovered in 1781 during the period of the American and French revolutions. It's discovery was made possible by the invention of the telescope, a development that has led to radical changes in our knowledge of the universe and our place in it.

In the birth chart then, Uranus represents the force for revolutionary change, the breaking from tradition, and inventiveness and experimentation. As one of the three planets that cannot be seen with the unaided eye, Uranus represents a force over which we have little or no conscious control. On an individual level, Uranus indicates our degree of independence and demand for personal freedom. If well aspected it gives us originality and an attunement to truth that goes beyond the logic of Mercury. If we refuse to express the energy of Uranus within us, preferring to cling to the traditions and limitations of Saturn, then Uranus may manifest as disruptions and sudden changes in our immediate environment, sometimes disrupting our lives completely and forcing us to make needed changes. If the energy of Uranus is expressed negatively, it can lead to wilfulness, impatience and needless rebellion, the rebel without a cause.

The position of Uranus in the chart shows where we most feel the need for freedom and independence and the need to experiment with new ideas and ways of living. Conversely, it is the area where we can cause the most disruption and needless change.

Uranus in Libra

You attract unusual friends and unconventional romance but will always demand freedom and space to pursue your own goals and ambitions. So do think twice before rushing headlong into making a long term commitment or the relationship could end in divorce or separation. Nevertheless, your ability to communicate new ideas to others can help open their minds to possibilities and experiences never experienced before.



Uranus in 12th House

Uranus in the 12th House of your chart stimulates the urge to understand yourself and your own unconscious motivations. The unconscious contains many repressed and forgotten experiences, particularly painful experiences as a child tend to be pushed into the unconscious, the energy of these experiences does not go away, but leaks out in other forms. You may find yourself unconsciously setting yourself up in situations where you have to re-live the pain that you have repressed in yourself. Without knowing the real source of these situations, it is all too easy to blame other people. Bringing these buried experiences to consciousness, and fully acknowledging the hurt that you feel, will release a lot of energy that can be consciously directed to more creative ends.





Neptune

After Uranus comes Neptune, the god of the sea. Whereas Uranus is the urge for individual freedom and independence, Neptune is the urge to escape from our normal sense-bound state of consciousness, and experience our unity with a different level of reality.

In the birth chart, Neptune represents our higher ideals and our attunement to realities that lie beyond that perceived by the senses. It is the realm of dreams and imagination and our sense of being part of a whole which is greater than ourselves, the awareness of a spiritual dimension to existence. Neptune represents the urge to transcend our normal state of consciousness through meditation and mystical experience, music, dreams and flights of the imagination, or through drugs (including alcohol) which afford us a temporary escape from the mundane grind of living. Neptune can be expressed as high ideals, altruism and spiritual values, or as self destructive escapism and evasion of responsibilities. For most of us it is a mixture of both.

The position of Neptune in the chart shows where and how we seek to express these needs, and in what areas of our lives we tend to seek an often impossible ideal.

Neptune in Scorpio

Born between 1957-1970 you are part of a permissive generation whose experimentation with sex and drugs invaded everyday life and eroded many traditional family values. This was also the most prominent time of the Cold War, a time of spies and secret surveillance.

**Neptune in 2nd House**

The House position of Neptune shows the area of life in which we experience confusion, uncertainty, or excessive idealism. The second House is concerned with material possessions, security, money and values. With Neptune here, you may find that there is an underlying sense of insecurity with regard to these matters. You may experience material and financial losses through confused or uncertain conditions, investments you thought were sound may turn out to be a fraud, or just unrealistic. You may have a tendency to idealise money and possessions, seeing them as the path to personal fulfilment and happiness, or be envious of those who have more than you and daydream about wealth.

On the other hand, you may feel a vague sense of guilt about what you possess, realising that there are many people far worse off than yourself. If you are spiritually inclined, you may give away all you own to those less fortunate, or at least feel that you should do, hence the sense of guilt for not living up to your own high ideals in this area. You may have doubts about your own innate gifts and abilities, but it is by recognising your own value, determining and developing your talents and gifts, and using these for the benefit of others, that you can best handle this placing.

**Pluto**

Pluto is the outermost planet in the solar system and therefore the slowest moving. At certain times however, due to the high eccentricity of its orbit, it comes closer to the earth than Neptune. This was so from 1984 -1999. At that same time it passed through Scorpio, the sign that it rules. This was a very critical period in world history, since Pluto represents powerful forces of death and destruction or change and transformation, which were at their strongest. This could have lead to destruction through nuclear war or our pollution and exploitation of our planet or to the death of the current political and economical systems and the birth of new political and economic systems, together with a transformation in international relations as well as our relationship to our planet. When Pluto left Scorpio in 1999 these all issues were much altered.

In the individual birth chart, Pluto represents the urge for power and control either over ourselves or others. It is the need to penetrate beneath the surface of experience, to reveal hidden motivations and repressed desires. The position of Pluto in the chart indicates our capacity for self-regeneration or rebirth and our attitude towards beginnings and endings and birth and death, either actual or symbolic. Pluto can be expressed as the acceptance of our need for complete transformation in some area of our life, and the courage to face our deepest compulsions and hang-ups. Or, it can be expressed as the wilful manipulation of others, ruthlessness and an infatuation with power.

**Pluto in Virgo**

Pluto was in Virgo between 1957-1971. When you were born your generation experienced a time of powerful political forces such as trade unions, unparalleled changes within the health and welfare system, a time of tremendous changes within many work environments due to computers and automation. New developments in birth control led to greater sexual freedom, and experimentation with psychedelic drugs revealed previously unknown levels of consciousness.

11th House

The 11th House is naturally associated with the sign of Aquarius and its ruler Uranus.

Having established a career, public position or our social standing in the 10th, in the 11th House we look to the future and the part we can play as members of various groups or societies. The 11th House therefore represents our hopes and wishes, friends and groups. It is in this area of experience that we seek to act as part of a group that is expressing some greater social need or goal. This house in the chart can indicate how we act in group situations and the kinds of groups to which we are attracted.

**Pluto in 11th House**

With Pluto in the 11th House of your chart, the House of group associations, goals and objectives, it is here that you will need to confront the transforming power of Pluto. 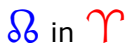
